

Funding the Future: Part 6

External research funding is critical to the strategic plan of Michigan State University, and the business school is increasingly expected to play a role in both leading and supporting large scale funded research projects. This funding also helps support faculty via summer salary and course buyouts, doctoral students via stipends and travel, and overhead support to both the college and units.

Accepted proposals have passed an additional layer of peer review that is direct evidence of research accomplishment, and in most cases, supports future publications, citations, and doctoral student placements. Thus, as part of the plan to expand the evidence of what constitutes research accomplishment, the current Strategic Plan for Research and Scholarship recognizes the following faculty members who, according to the Office of Sponsored Programs, received an award in excess of \$50,000 (relative to their effort on the project team) during the recently completed academic year (July 1, 2022 – June 30, 2023).
